## NATSICC WEEK

### **(National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People Catholic Council)**

NATSICC week is an annual occasion which celebrates and promotes the culture and spirituality of fellow Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics. We note that the 2021 Senior Australian of the year was Miriam Rose Ungummnur a resident of Doly River in NT and former Principal of the Catholic Primary School, honorary PHD and author of "Dadirri" a famous teaching on Faith in Christ and contemplation from an Aboriginal understanding.

NATSICC is held annually and on the week prior to NAIDOC (National Aboriginal Islander Observance Committee). NATSICC is funded by the Catholic Church and Caritas Australia.

### **Some NATSICC Statistics**

There are 133, 528 Catholic Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people

In Diocese around Australia, Brisbane has 15,403 Aboriginal people who identify as Catholic. Darwin has 11,271 then Maitland Newcastle 7,235!

5.8% of the catholic population in Australia are children under age 5; and in the Catholic Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population are 10.2% of children under age 5.

The acknowledgement of country-expression of respect for the country and the waters and its people.

### **Welcome to Country**

-a ceremony where Elders welcome people to their land. This ceremony is considered to be a right and not a privilege.

### **The NATSICC Acknowledgement Plaque**

The image on this plaque has a message which expresses establishing bonds of reconciliation and unity. The plaques are coloured and in A4 or A3 paper size. Our Parish Council will be invited to give consideration to purchasing the A4 size plaques for each of our church buildings and our schools. They will be a symbol of recognition and welcome. The plaque has been designed by Murri Ministry Team in Brisbane. It depicts reconciliation and togetherness in Christ.

*(We are in the country of the Worimi, Gamilleroi, Wanarua, Gweagul, Darkinjung, Biripi and Awabakal peoples. We respectfully acknowledge their Elders, celebrate their continuing culture and the living memory of their ancestors.)*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.' The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'


